### EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

A grand stage with a vacant podium and a panel of distinguished individuals come INTO VIEW. The distinguished individuals are seated in a semi-circle position consisting of veterans, listeners, and the decorated Navy Vice Admiral THOMAS CONNERS.

From the stage POV, a large, seated audience of civilians, additional veterans, and active military personnel awaits the start of the program. Aligned on either side of the audience, members from each branch of the U.S. Military stand stoically as an oversized American flag waves in the background. Vice Admiral Conners stands and approach the podium. He gives a stiff nod and welcoming smile.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS

HELLO, ALL, AND WELCOME! WELCOME TO THE VETERANS MILITARY LISTENING POST, TELLER AND LISTENER MISSION.

He opens the thin leather binder sitting upon the podium surface.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS (CONT'D)

YOU KNOW, BY YOUR
ATTENDANCE HERE TODAY, YOU
DEMONSTRATE AN EXTREMELY

HIGH FORM OF PATRIOTISM. IT IS SIMPLE. IT IS CALLED, LISTENING. WE, AT VETERANS MILITARY LISTENING POST SAY THAT PATRIOTISM COMES IN MANY FORMS. LISTENING TO OUR VETERANS AND MILITARY IS PATRIOTISM, AT ITS BEST.

PAN ACROSS the distinguished panel on stage.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS
(O.S.) (CONT'D)

THE PERSONAL AND UNIVERSAL STORIES YOU WILL EXPERIENCE HERE TODAY WILL SERVE THE PURPOSE OF DEMONSTRATING THE POWER OF TRANSFORMATIVE PROGRAMS OF TURNAROUND, WITH UPLIFTING AND POSITIVE STEADY STATE STORY POWER.

PAN ACROSS the countless faces of the civilian and military audience.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS (O.S.) (CONT'D)

SEEING AND HEARING THE
FOLLOWING STORIES, ONE CAN
ALSO CONNECT AND RECOGNIZE
THAT THESE STORIES ARE PART
OF US ALL. IN FACT, AS THIS
DEMONSTRATION PROGRESSES,
YOU, THE AUDIENCE, WILL
BECOME PART OF THE PROGRAM
SIMPLY BY PARTICIPATING
THROUGH LISTENING.

CLOSE-UP on the Vice Admiral.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS (CONT'D)

WE, HERE AT VETERANS
MILITARY LISTENING POST
BELIEVE THAT THIS PROGRAM
WILL TOUCH YOUR HEART, SO
THAT YOU TOO WILL BE
TRANSFORMED AND BE A TELLER
AND LISTENER PATRIOT FOR
OUR VETERANS, OUR MILITARY.

Before continuing, Vice Admiral Conners takes a moment to look over the faces of the men and women before him.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS (CONT'D)

WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK OUR PRODUCERS AND SPONSORS FOR GRANTING US THIS OPPORTUNITY. MORE IMPORTANTLY, WE WOULD LIKE TO THANK THE MEMBERS OF OUR MILITARY WHO ARE PRESENTLY SERVING, BY EXPRESSING OUR MOST SINCERE GRATITUDE FOR THEIR POWERFUL, PROTECTIVE STRENGTH OF SERVICE FOR US AND THE FREE WORLD.

PAN ACROSS the standing members of the military. Their eyes full of respect, honor, and pride.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS

(CONT'D)

IN THE MILITARY, THE TERM, FORWARD MARCH REPRESENTS THE PROGRESS OF MOVING AHEAD IN A STRONG, PURPOSEFUL DIRECTION. THEREFORE, AUDIENCE, WE WILL START THIS PROGRAM WITH AND A PROUD AND ASTOUNDING:

(shouting)

#### FORWARD MARCH!

A LOUD whistle is heard. The audience turns in the direction of small military band from afar that begins to march in sync and make its way towards the stage and the listening post.

CUT TO:

#### <VINTAGE STOCK FOOTAGE>:

The sight of various military listening posts from years past are shown. The dramatic and powerful voice of a NARRATOR suddenly cuts into the scene.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

MILITARY FORCES HAVE USED LISTENING POSTS FOR EARLY WARNING DETECTION AND PROTECTION AGAINST THEIR OPPOSITION FOR AS LONG AS CONFLICTS HAVE EXISTED. WHEN NIGHTTIME COMES, IN A HOSTILE MILITARY ENVIRONMENT, A UNIT

COMMANDER WILL DEPLOY A MANNED TEAM SOME DISTANCE BEYOND THE COMPANY'S FORTIFIED PERIMETER.

Continue stock footage demonstrate the listening post in action with listening post nighttime maneuvers.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE DISTINCT PURPOSE HERE
IS TO PROTECT THE MAIN
DETACHMENT FROM SURPRISE
ATTACKS. THE TEAM HAS
SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO
LISTEN FOR SOUNDS AND
MOVEMENTS WHICH MAY POSE A
THREAT OF IMMINENT HARM TO
THEIR MILITARY UNIT. WHEN
HOSTILITY IS DETECTED...

Continued stock footage reveal choreographed movement of the military units to demonstrate hearing noises, exemplifying how a listening post returns to the company perimeter for safety.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

...THE MANNED TEAM RETURNS
TO THEIR BASE TO ALERT THE
COMPANY. THE TEAM THEN USES
A PASSWORD TO RETURN TO THE
SAFETY OF THE UNIT'S
FORTIFIED AREA.

CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

As the song "When Johnny Comes Marching Home" begins, a well-dressed group of DANCERS in uniform begin a choreographed close-order drill.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THE WORD VETERAN MEANS "ONE WHO HAS GIVEN MILITARY SERVICE TO THEIR COUNTRY". THE WORD ALSO HAS A CIVILIAN DICTIONARY DEFINITION, MEANING A PERSON WHO HAS HAD LONG SERVICE OR EXPERIENCE IN AN OCCUPATION OR FIELD. EVENTUALLY, WE ALL BECOME VETERANS IN OUR OWN WAY.

The dancer's movements are beautifully performed for a minute before they pause at attention in front of their drill sergeant, halting sharply to parade rest.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE U.S. ARMED FORCES ARE EXTREMELY EFFECTIVE AT

TRANSFORMING ORDINARY PEOPLE INTO MILITARY EXPERTS.

THIS TRANSFORMATION IS FUNDAMENTAL FOR THE MILITARY'S MISSION TO SUCCEED.

PAN ACROSS the stern, disciplined faces of the dancers.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

JUST AS THE MILITARY
TRANSFORMS ITS SOLDIERS,
VLP BELIEVES THAT LISTENING
TO THE STORIES OF VETERANS
AND ACTIVE MILITARY, WITH
THE FOCUS ON POSITIVE
OUTCOMES AND OPPORTUNITIES,
CAN TRANSFORM ALL WHO
PARTICIPATE WITH THIS
PROCESS, IN AN
EXTRAORDINARILY BENEFICIAL
WAY.

DRILL SERGEANT

### COMMENCE!

Suddenly, the dancers continue with another drill expertise for another minute.

CUT TO:

<VINTAGE STOCK FOOTAGE>:

As the music continues to play, the sight of various military drill teams from years past are shown. CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

As the song, "Yankee Doodle" begins to play, the band begins to march. After a minute, the song and march come to an end and the audience applauds their performance. After which, a brief moment of them smiling, hugging, and shaking hands with veterans take place.

VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS

WE ARE ALL EXCELLENT
LISTENERS. LISTENING
DEMONSTRATES THE POWER OF
POSITIVE INFLUENCE. THE
STORIES THAT WE WILL LISTEN
TO HERE TODAY, ARE STORIES
OF BRAVERY, ENDURANCE,
SKILL, AND PASSIONATE
EFFORT IN EVERYDAY LIFE.

The Vice Admiral gestures to the panel of individuals on stage.

# VICE ADMIRAL CONNERS (CONT'D)

AS YOU SEE AND HEAR THESE STORIES, YOU WILL FIND YOURSELF THINKING THINGS LIKE, "I LIKE THIS," OR PERHAPS, "I CAN RELATE TO THAT," OR "I ADMIRE THAT STORY". LET US FOLLOW THIS ROAD TO STRENGTH AND STABILITY AS WE ALSO PARTICIPATE IN THESE STORIES.

As Vice Admiral Conners take a seat, the dancers adjacent to the stage form a circle then nod to the listeners on stage. All eyes are now upon the listeners as the audience watch them smile, shake hands, and relax.

After which, CHARLIE, one of the individuals sitting among the semi-circle on stage stands and approaches the podium. He appears a bit timid as he looks out across the vast audience. He glances back at the Vice Admiral who gives him a nod of confidence to proceed.

Charlie takes a deep breath as he turns back to the audience.

CHARLIE

HI, LISTENING POST. MY
NAME IS CHARLIE. I AM A
VETERAN; AND I HAVE A STORY
TO TELL.

STAGE LISTENERS

CHARLIE, TELL YOUR STORY!

The faces of the audience appear interested and engaged.

CHARLIE

AFTER SPENDING SIX MONTHS ON THE COMBAT LINES NEAR THE IRAQI BORDER, IT FELT LIKE NEVER-ENDING DAYS, EACH DAY BLENDING INTO THE NEXT.

Charles appears to gather his thoughts.

CHARLIE (CONT'D)

YOU LIVE WITH A SEMI-HEIGHTENED FEELING OF MENTAL READINESS THAT BURNS RIGHT THROUGH YOU. RECEIVING NEWS AND SUPPORT FROM HOME, ALWAYS MANAGED TO LIFT ME UP WHEN THINGS SEEMED TO BE PUSHING ME DOWN.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: The sight of young military soldiers eagerly receiving mail and reading letters with heartfelt joy.

CHARLIE (V.O.) (CONT'D)

MY PLATOON BUDDIES ALSO PROVIDED UPLIFTING SUPPORT.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Young soldiers chatting and smiling with one another.

CHARLIE (V.O.) (CONT'D)

MY PLATOON SERGEANT, AND MY PLATOON LEADER-- THE LIEUTENANT, ALWAYS SEEMED TO BE ON LEVEL GROUND. THEIR STRONG LEADERSHIP NEVER WAVERED FROM MISSION TO MISSION.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Steadfast platoon leaders having uplifting conversations with the new recruits.

CHARLIE (V.O.) (CONT'D)

EVEN THOUGH WE FACED SOME VERY TOUGH TIMES, I VIEW THEIR SUPPORT AS POSITIVE PARTS OF MY MILITARY EXPERIENCE.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Young soldiers performing various duties on base.

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

Charlie continues to speak, addressing the audience with growing comfort.

CHARLIE (CONT'D)

FITTING BACK INTO MY
CIVILIAN LIFE HAS COME WITH
ITS OWN CHALLENGES. WHAT I
AM NOW CALLING MY "CIVILIAN
LIFE'S MISSION" IS TO
CONTINUE AS I DID WITH MY
TRAINING, UTILIZING THE
RESOURCES I GAINED FROM THE
MILITARY, WHICH, IN THE
LONG RUN, CONTINUE SERVING
ME WELL.

PAN ACROSS the attentive stares of the audience and veterans.

CHARLIE (V.O.) (CONT'D)

OUTSIDE CIRCUMSTANCES DO NOT DISRUPT THE MENTAL READINESS I LEARNED DURING MY MILITARY SERVICE. I TRY TO ADJUST AND ADAPT TO THE COURSE WHICH BEST SUITS ME. SO, THIS IS MY STORY. I MUST SAY, I AM VERY APPRECIATIVE THAT SOMEONE WOULD TAKE THE TIME TO LISTEN.

Charlie looks back at the stage listeners. They give him a collection of encouraging smiles. Charlie turns back to the audience and raises a hand.

CHARLIE (CONT'D)

THANK YOU, AUDIENCE.

Just then, one female listeners on stage raises her hand and stands.

GAIL

HI, CHARLIE! MY NAME IS GAIL.

Charlie looks at her and smiles. Gail approaches him at the podium.

GAIL (CONT'D)

I AM HAPPY TO BE ONE OF YOUR LISTENERS. YOUR STORY IS ENCOURAGING FOR ME. THERE ARE POSITIVE ATTRIBUTES IN YOUR DESCRIPTION THAT HONOR YOU.

Charlie nods respectfully.

GAIL (CONT'D)

YOUR INFORMATION HAS ALSO GIVEN ME A BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF HOW THINGS REALLY ARE ON THE COMBAT LINES.

Gail glances at the audience then back to Charlie.

GAIL (CONT'D)

I NOW ALSO UNDERSTAND JUST HOW IMPORTANT IT IS TO RECEIVE NEWS FROM LOVED ONES. YOUR STORY TAKES UNCERTAINTY AND TURNS IT INTO CERTAINTY. THANK YOU FOR YOUR STORY, CHARLIE,

AND YOUR INSPIRING DIRECTION.

Gail reaches out and gentle touches Charlie's forearm.

GAIL (CONT'D)

I WILL ALWAYS BE GRATEFUL TO YOU, AND ALL VETERANS FOR YOUR SERVICE.

CHARLIE

THANK YOU, GAIL. YOUR KIND WORDS MEAN A LOT AND ARE VERY MUCH APPRECIATED.

As Gail returns to her seat, Charlie turns his attention to the audience.

CHARLIE (CONT'D)

IT IS TRANSFORMATIVE TO SHARE WITH SOMEONE WHO LISTENS TO YOUR STORY. TELLING MY STORY IS IMPORTANT TO ME.

Charlie pauses momentarily, exuding a look of humility.

CHARLIE (CONT'D)

THE ABILITY TO SHARE MY STORY WITH YOU IS TRULY WONDERFUL AND HEARTENING FOR ME. AND AGAIN, I THANK YOU, AUDIENCE.

After the audience claps, "I Like Your Hat" begins to play. PAN OVER to the dancers and band members who now clap and chant in unison.

BAND AND DANCERS (enthusias tically)

I LIKE YOUR HAT! I LIKE
YOU HAT! I LIKE YOUR HAT!

They suddenly begin a choreographed dance while gesturing towards their respective hats. NARRATOR (V.O.)

A PERSONAL WAY OF
RECOGNIZING AND LISTENING
TO VETERANS AND MILITARY IS
THROUGH THEIR HATS.
VETERANS LOVE THEIR HATS.
MOST VETERANS' HATS TEND TO
SHOW THEIR BRANCH OF
SERVICE, SUCH AS THE ARMY,

NAVY, AIR FORCE, MARINES, NATIONAL GUARD, OR COAST GUARD.

As the song dies down, it is replaced by the song "In Your Easter Bonnet".

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

SOMETIMES THE ACTUAL TERM
OF SERVICE IS DISPLAYED ON
THEIR HATS. THIS IS ALL
VERY GOOD. BE PROUD OF YOUR
SERVICE AND LET EVERYONE
ELSE BE THANKFUL FOR THE
SERVICE THAT YOU PROVIDED.

As the music continues to play, the dancers pass by each other demonstrating humorous gestures towards their hats. The audience reacts with smiles of amusement.

CUT TO:

EXT. CONVENIENCE STORE -- DAY

A grinning young woman approaches an elderly veteran exiting the store. The man is wearing his veteran's cap.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

HERE'S THE CATCH:
SOMETIMES, FOR A MOMENT, A
VETERAN MIGHT FORGET THAT
THEY'RE WEARING THEIR
VETERAN'S HAT. A PERSON
MIGHT COME ALONG AND CONVEY
SINCERE APPRECIATION.

YOUNG WOMAN

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE.

The elderly man looks a bit confused.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

SOMETIMES THERE IS A MOMENT OF SILENCE AS THE VETERAN TRIES TO FIGURE OUT WHAT THAT PERSON IS TALKING ABOUT, BEFORE THE VETERAN REALIZES THEIR HAT SPARKED THE COMMENT AND IS THEN ABLE TO RESPOND.

The elderly man sees the young woman glancing up at his hat.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

A VERY EASY WAY OF GIVING RECOGNITION, WHEN PASSING

BY A PERSON WHO'S DISPLAYING THEIR MILITARY SERVICE HAT, IS SIMPLY TO SAY:

YOUNG WOMAN

I LIKE YOUR HAT.

A firm smile eases across the man's face.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THIS WORKS VERY WELL. IT
IS A VERY QUICK AND
COMPLETE COMMENT WHICH
IMMEDIATELY IDENTIFIES WHAT
THE SPEAKER IS REFERRING
TO, WHILE SIMULTANEOUSLY
RECOGNIZING THE VETERAN'S
SERVICE TO HIS/HER COUNTRY.

ELDERLY VETERAN

THANK YOU.

YOUNG WOMAN
(Gratefull
expressio
n)

MY PLEASURE, SIR.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

IN JUST THOSE FEW MOMENTS,
THE VETERAN RECEIVES A
WELCOME MOMENT OF
RECOGNITION THAT YOU HAVE
PROVIDED, CREATING A
POSITIVE AND TRANSFORMATIVE
OUTCOME FOR ALL.

CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

The dancer brings their choreographed routine to an end and turn to each other.

DANCERS (In

unison)

I LIKE YOUR HAT.

After which, they exchange big smiles and handshakes.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: The Blue Angels flying by overhead in tight formation.

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

As the song "Off We Go into The Wild Blue Yonder" begins to play, the listeners and veterans on stage stand in unison and connect with each other arm-in-arm showing friendliness,

The dances transition from their circle to listeners in the audience while gesturing to the panel on stage. As the demonstration concludes, the music ends with everyone shaking hands. Afterwards, the dancers and band member assume their halted stances as the stage panel return to their seats.

Once everyone settles, the Vice Admiral nods to another veteran on stage. A man name ALAN stands and approaches the podium.

ALAN

HI. MY NAME IS ALAN.

STAGE LISTENERS (In

unison)

HI, ALAN! WHAT'S YOUR STORY?

ALAN

MY AIR FORCE MILITARY
EXPERIENCE WAS THE
STEPPING-STONE TO REACHING
MANY OF MY LIFE GOALS. I
WENT THROUGH INTENSE
SCHOOLING IN VARIOUS AIR
FORCE TRAINING CENTERS.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Scenes of Air Force training centers are shown.

ALAN (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THESE TRAINING CENTERS GAVE
ME THE STRENGTH TO TOUGH
OUT THE ROUGH SPOTS AND
ADJUST TO THE MIDDLE GROUND
WITH CONFIDENCE. THIS
ENABLES ME TO CONTINUE TO
MOVE FORWARD UNTIL THINGS
POSITION THEMSELVES IN A
CLEARER WAY.

MY MILITARY TRAINING WAS A DISCIPLINED JOURNEY. IT TAUGHT ME TRUSTWORTHINESS, RELIABILITY, AND PROFESSIONALISM.

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

ALAN (V.O.) (CONT'D)

WHEN I FALL FROM GRACE,
WHICH HAPPENS OFTEN, I CALL
UP THE PARTS OF MY AIR
FORCE TRAINING AND
DISCIPLINE THAT HAVE TIME
AND AGAIN PROVEN TO HELP ME
GET BACK ON TRACK.

Alan gives a sincere and grateful scan across the audience.

ALAN (CONT'D)

IT'S TRULY A BLESSING TO
HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO
SPEAK. THE FACT THAT I CAN
EXPRESS MYSELF AND MY
PURPOSE AND BE HEARD MEANS
A LOT TO ME. THANKS,
LISTENING POST.

As Alan puts his hand over his heart and smiles, a listener name ROBERTO stands to reply.

ROBERTO

ALAN, THIS IS ROBERTO. I JOINED THE LISTENING POST TO SEE WHAT HELP I COULD GIVE AS A LISTENER.

Roberto also lifts his hand upon his chest.

ROBERTO (CONT'D)

WELL, YOUR STORY HAS HELPED ME UNDERSTAND WHAT IT MEANS TO BUILD A SUPPORT NETWORK THAT I CAN DRAW UPON FROM THE MANY POSITIVE LIFE EXPERIENCES THAT I HAVE EXPERIENCED MYSELF.

Roberto gestures with respect and confidence.

ROBERTO (CONT'D)

AFTER LISTENING TO YOUR STORY, I HAVE RECOGNIZED THE RESOURCES THAT I'VE ALREADY ACQUIRED, SUCH AS THE GOOD FRIENDS AND CO-WORKERS WHO HAVE HELPED ME WITH MY GOALS.

A nod from Roberto follows.

ROBERTO (CONT'D)

YOUR STORY WAS HELPFUL. THANK YOU, ALAN. I WAS SUPPOSED TO HELP YOU BY LISTENING.

(Light chuckle)

TURNS OUT YOU ENDED UP HELPING ME!

A light chuckle from the audience ensues. Alan smiles, nods back to Roberto, then turns his attention to the audience as Roberto sits.

ALAN

I AM BUILDING MY STEADY STATE STORY JOURNEY ALL THE TIME, WITH BULLET PROOF CONFIDENCE IN MYSELF. I'M GLAD I CAN TELL MY STORY.

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. MILITARY BUS (IN MOTION) -- DAY

As the song, "You're in the Army now" begins to play, the new recruits are seen talking, smiling, and laughing. From the bus driver's POV, the long road ahead is shown.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

HAVE YOU EVER EXPERIENCED A LONG BUS RIDE OR TAKEN A BUS FROM UPTOWN TO DOWNTOWN?

JUMP CUT TO:

EXT. ARMY BASE -- DAY

Drill Sergeant appears and waits for bus arrival. The bus eventually comes to a halt. The bus door opens. The new recruits begin to file off the bus.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

WHEN WE EXIT THE BUS AT THE BUS STOP, WE TAKE A FEW SECONDS TO REORIENT OURSELVES, TO DETERMINE WHERE WE ARE, AND IN WHAT DIRECTION WE WANT TO PROCEED.

As the men stir about with disoriented and curious expressions, they attentively observe their new environment.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

ONCE WE ADJUST TO OUR SURROUNDINGS, WE DEVELOP A PLAN TO CONTINUE THE NEXT LEG OF OUR JOURNEY.

The Drill Sergeant starts to direct the men where to stand. The men quickly adhere to his instruction. NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

IMAGINE THIS BUS RIDE!
THIRTY NEW RECRUITS ON A
BUS, AND THE LAST AND ONLY
STOP IS UNITED STATES ARMY
BASE, BASIC TRAINING CENTER
- FORT JACKSON, IN
COLUMBIA, SOUTH CAROLINA.
THIS BUS STOP IS A REAL
LIFE-CHANGER!

CLOSE-UP on the stoic, determined expressions on the men's faces as they stand in perfect formation. NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

ONCE OFF THE BUS AND STANDING BEFORE A U.S. ARMY DRILL SERGEANT, A STARE OF REALIZATION GLARES IN THE EYES OF THE NEW RECRUITS.

The Drill Sergeant strolls by the men unhurriedly with a stern, no-nonsense stare, projecting an aura of leadership and firm command.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE DRILL SERGEANT IS THEIR NEW REORIENTATION EXPERT.
IT IS CLEAR TO THESE NEW RECRUITS THAT PLAYTIME IS OVER. CAREFREE TOURISM IS NOT ON THE AGENDA; FOR THIS IS THE BUS STOP THAT WILL CHANGE THEIR LIVES FOREVER.

DRILL SERGEANT

'CRUITS!

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THIS THUNDEROUS WORD
REVERBERATES THROUGH THE
RECRUITS, SHAKING THEM TO
THEIR CORE.

RECRUITS

SIR, YES, SIR!

#### NARRATOR (V.O.)

DRILL SERGEANTS ARE THE MILITARY'S BACKBONE. THEY ARE THE TRAINERS OF TRANSFORMATION, INGRAINING THE ENDURING STRENGTH ONE WILL NEED FOR MILITARY SERVICE.

DRILL SERGEANT (abrupt)

I SAID, 'CRUITS!

In their idle stance, the men strive to remain unrattled. Yet in the presence of the Drill Sergeant's authoritative presence, noticeable apprehension is stamped upon their faces.

RECRUITS

SIR, YES, SIR!

DRILL SERGEANT

WHERE DO YOU THINK YOU ARE?! YOU ARE NOW IN MY HOUSE, AND IN MY HOUSE, NOBODY EVER WALKS! YOU NEVER WALK IN MY HOUSE!

Coupled with his angry expression, the Drill Sergeant appears to breath hard through clenched teeth.

DRILL SERGEANT (CONT'D)

YOU WILL ALWAYS RUN IN MY HOUSE! IS THAT CLEAR, 'CRUITS?!

RECRUITS

SIR, YES, SIR!

DRILL SERGEANT

I WANT A SINGLE LINE RIGHT HERE!

The recruits run in disorderly fashion, lining up hurriedly as commanded.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

FOR THE NEW RECRUITS, THIS IS UNLIKE ANY OTHER BUS STOP. THEY ARE STUNNED AND STILLED.

DRILL SERGEANT

FROM HERE ON OUT, THE ONLY TWO WORDS I WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU ARE: "YES, SERGEANT!" DO I MAKE MYSELF CLEAR?!

RECRUITS

(In

unison)

YES, SERGEANT!

PAN ACROSS the obedient faces of the men as they stand perfectly at full attention.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

ONE WOULD THINK THAT HAVING ARRIVED AT THIS BUS STOP, THE DAYS THAT FOLLOW WOULD BE SOMETHING TO FEAR, BUT THAT'S NOT SO.

JUMP CUT TO:

EXT. BOOT CAMP TRAINING GROUNDS -- DAY TRACK with the new recruits as they face various course obstacles.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THE INTENSIVE TRAINING
WHICH FOLLOWS ARRIVING AT
THIS BUS STOP BECOMES A
TWELVE-WEEK JOURNEY THAT
TRANSFORMS THESE BUS
RIDERS, THESE RECRUITS,
INTO POLISHED, PERFORMANCEORIENTED AMERICAN SOLDIERS.

Training on the obstacle course continues.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

DECIDING TO GO IN A
POSITIVE DIRECTION, EVEN AT
UNCERTAIN BUS STOPS IN
LIFE, OPENS INNUMERABLE
DOORS AND CREATES COUNTLESS
POSSIBILITIES FOR POSITIVE
OUTCOMES IN YOUR LIFE.

The recruits stand in lines doing jumping jacks in unison before eventually stopping on cue.  ${\tt NARRATOR} \quad ({\tt CONT"D})$ 

THE RECEIVING DRILL SERGEANT, WHOSE VOICE PROJECTS AN UNMATCHED DEMEANOR OF LEADERSHIP AND COMMAND, INSTRUCTS THE BUS RIDERS.

DRILL SERGEANT #2

FOLLOW ME!

Suddenly, the Drill Sergeant starts to jog, and the men immediately follow suit, jogging in perfect sync behind him.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

SO, BELIEVE IN THE GOOD POSSIBILITIES WHEN YOU ARE AT UNCERTAIN STOPS AND CROSSROADS IN LIFE, AND THEN BE ASSURED THOSE GOOD THINGS WILL FOLLOW.

DISSOLVE TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

As the song, "You Are My Hero" plays, the audience appear utterly engrossed and eager to continue listening. They stare inquisitively towards the stage as the veterans, listeners, and the Vice Admiral gather in a circle of smiles and happiness.

A moment later, as the song subsides, everyone on stage returns to their seats as a veteran named SAMANTHA approaches the podium.

SAMANTHA

HELLO, LISTENING POST. MY NAME IS SAMANTHA.

STAGE LISTENERS

HELLO, SAMANTHA!

SAMANTHA

I AM ON THIS ROAD WITH YOU, AND I'M QUITE THANKFUL TO YOU GUYS. I'D LIKE TO TELL YOU ABOUT A STORY DURING MY TIME IN THE NATIONAL GUARD. WHEN I WAS CALLED FOR SERVICE IN 2005 DURING THE IRAQ CONFLICT, MY UNIT WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR A PART OF THE SECURITY CALLED THE GREEN ZONE IN THE BAGHDAD AREA OF IRAQ.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Scenes of National Guard soldiers moving about areas of Baghdad, Iraq are shown.

SAMANTHA (V.O.) (CONT'D)

GREEN ZONE IS A MILITARY
TERM THAT SPECIFIES AN AREA
THAT IS CONSIDERED
RELATIVELY SAFE FROM
INSURGENTS AND ENEMY
FORCES.

MY UNIT SAW ITS FAIR SHARE
OF ACTION THROUGHOUT MY
TOUR, WHICH WAS THIRTEEN
MONTHS. AT TIMES, I THOUGHT
IT WOULD NEVER END.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Scenes of intense moments for the National Guard soldiers, followed by scenes of the soldiers supporting and encouraging one another.

SAMANTHA (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THERE WERE BOTH GOOD AND TOUGH TIMES. IT IS THE GOOD TIMES I CHOOSE TO REMEMBER AND THE TOUGH TIMES I CHOOSE TO LET GO.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: National Guard soldiers laughing and smiling with each other while attending to the less fortunate natives.

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

SAMANTHA (CONT'D)

I GUESS YOU COULD SAY THAT IN THE LONG RUN, I FOUND SOME GOOD BUDDIES AND LEARNED SOME GREAT LESSONS THAT I BELIEVE WILL NOW HELP ME IN MY PRESENT LIFE.

Samantha looks back and smiles at the individuals on stage. She then looks out across the audience and raising a hand.

SAMANTHA (V.O.)

THANKS, GUYS, FOR
LISTENING. I NEEDED TO
TELL THIS STORY.

While embracing claps from the audience, Samantha gives high-fives to the stage listeners. After which, a listener name DENISE stands from the semi-circle and approaches Samantha at the podium.

DENISE

HI, SAMANTHA! I'M DENISE.
HEY! WOW! GOOD STORY!
YOU HAVE A VERY HEALTHY

OUTLOOK ON YOUR TIME IN THE SERVICE. THIRTEEN MONTHS IS A LONG TIME TO BE AWAY FROM YOUR HOME AND FAMILY.

Denise lifts her hand upon her chest.

DENISE (CONT'D)

I ADMIRE THE WAY YOU HAVE CHOSEN TO REMEMBER THE GOOD. ALSO, THE INFORMATION YOU PROVIDED ABOUT THE GREEN ZONE IS INTERESTING. YOU ARE A GOOD STORYTELLER. PLEASE CONTINUE WITH MORE STORIES.

Samantha faces audience.

SAMANTHA

THANK YOU, DENISE. I WILL.
I HAVE A TURNAROUND STORY
THAT'S A WORK-IN-PROGRESS.
I HOPE TO SHARE IT SOMEDAY
SOON. FOR NOW, AS I WORK
THROUGH IT, TELLING MY
STORY I'VE SHARED TODAY
MAKES ME REALIZE HOW
IMPORTANT I AM IN MY OWN
JOURNEY.

Denise walks over to Samantha, and they hug.  ${\tt DENISE}$ 

THANK YOU, SAMANTHA, FOR SHARING.

As the audience looks on completely enthralled, the sound of eerie jungle noises creep into the scene. CUT TO:

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: As the jungle sounds increase and continue, the sight of a comic book military unit on combat patrol from the 1950's comes INTO VIEW. The unit is seen being led by the fictional DC Comics character SERGEANT ROCK.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

BACK IN THE 1950'S, THERE WAS A FAMOUS COMIC BOOK MILITARY HERO KNOWN AS SERGEANT ROCK. SERGEANT ROCK READILY EXHIBITED THE HEROISM OF THE SERGEANTS OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES. THE NAME, SERGEANT

ROCK, SIGNIFIES COURAGE AND BRAVERY.

As more comic book scenes of Sergeant Rock and his combat unit are shown, "drum music" is heard over the eerie jungle sounds.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THERE IS A PART OF THE SERGEANT ROCK STORY WHICH REMAINS UNIVERSAL. IT CONTINUES TO BE A PART OF ALL OUR STORIES, EVEN TODAY.

More Sergeant Rock INSERTS are shown.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

MANY OF THE STORIES ABOUT
OUR LIVES, THE LIVES OF
VETERANS AND ACTIVE
MILITARY, ARE STORIES WHICH
HAVE DISTRESS, FEAR, SHOCK,
AND LOSS WOVEN INTO THEM.
MANY STORIES INCLUDE
HEROISM, LUCK, MAGIC, AND
MIRACLES.

PAN ACROSS countless cover issues and scene inserts of Sergeant Rock and his unit fighting gallantly against the enemy.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

IN MOST HEROIC MOVIES, WE SEE THE HERO GET PUMMELED, CRUSHED, AND FLATTENED. IT SEEMS, FOR THE MOMENT, THAT THERE IS NOTHING LEFT OF OUR HERO.

An image of Sergeant Rock and his unit looking battered and defeated comes INTO VIEW.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOU MIGHT SAY, "THAT'S THE END OF THAT HERO."
HOWEVER, THERE IS ALWAYS AN UPLIFTING MOMENT IN THESE STORIES, A TURNAROUND, A SMALL ACTION OF SACRIFICE, PERSEVERANCE, AND ENDURANCE, WHEN THE HERO OF THE STORY PERSONIFIED BY SERGEANT ROCK THE HERO WHO RESIDES IN ALL OF US, TURNS

THIS SEEMINGLY LOST AND FORGONE STORY INTO A NEW AND BETTER PRESENT STORY.

Triumphant and victorious images of Sergeant Rock and his until are now shown. The American flag is seen anchored in the ground with the sight of the defeated and retreating enemy in the background.

CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

As the drum music continues, the dancers display another choreographed routine while the band employs a creative display of sharp and distinctive movements.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

NO, IT'S NOT EASY, BUT WHAT HERO'S STORY IS? THROUGH SMALL ACTS OF TELLING AND LISTENING TO A NEW STORY, A TOUGH, HOPELESS MISSION CAN TURN INTO A POSITIVE, SUCCESSFUL MISSION.

The dancers and band continue their proud and patriotic display of impressive movements as the drum music abruptly transforms in a brief rendering of the U.S. Navy song "Anchors Aweigh". As the performance comes to an end, the stage panel smiles and shake hands yet again in the semicircle. After which, a veteran by the name of SUSAN stands and approaches the podium.

SUSAN

HI, LISTENING POST! MY NAME IS SUSAN.

The veterans and listeners acknowledge her with enthusiasm.

STAGE LISTENERS

HELLO, SUSAN! TELL YOUR STORY!

SUSAN

I HAVE BEEN LISTENING TO
THE STORIES AND WOULD LIKE
TO TELL ONE OF MY OWN. AS
A SINGLE MOTHER OF TWO, YOU
MIGHT THINK THAT IT WOULD
BE DIFFICULT TO MANAGE A
FAMILY AND RISE TO MEET THE
GOALS THAT THE ARMY DEMANDS
OF ITS STAFF.

Susan takes a deep breath and exhales for dramatic effect.

SUSAN (CONT'D)

WELL, IT IS! I'M STILL IN THE ARMY AFTER NINE YEARS,

AND MY GOAL IS TO MAKE THIS MY CAREER. I'M ALWAYS JUGGLING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF MY PROFESSION AND MY DUTIES AS A SINGLE MOTHER. IT IS EXTREMELY DIFFICULT--

PAN ACROSS the audience to see active-duty women shaking their heads in agreement. SUSAN (V.O.) (CONT D)

--YET WITH THE TREMENDOUS SUPPORT FROM THE SERVICES OF THE ARMY AND MY TEAM MEMBERS, I AM ABLE TO HAVE PLENTY OF GOOD THINGS TO SAY.

Continue to PAN across the audience as everyone listens attentively.

SUSAN (V.O.) (CONT'D)

I LIVE ON POST AND RECEIVE ARMY SERVICES ON BASE, LIKE HOUSING AND SCHOOLING FOR MY CHILDREN; SO, THIS HAS HELPED ME IN FULFILLING MY DUTIES BOTH MY CHILDREN AND TO MY COUNTRY.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Scenes of active-duty women working on base, as well as attending to their children at home, helping them with homework, kissing their husbands.

SUSAN (V.O.) (CONT'D)

I HAVE ATTAINED THE RANK OF SERGEANT FIRST CLASS. MY NEIGHBORS, THE ARMY WIVES AND MY FRIENDS ARE AN INVALUABLE RESOURCE TO ME. THEY HAVE HELPED ME WITH MY CHILDREN, AND WITH TIME MANAGEMENT.

Continue with scenes of active-duty women interacting with neighbors and their communities.  $SUSAN \quad (V.O.) \quad (CONT\ 'D)$ 

I'M HAPPY TO BE ABLE TO TELL MY STORY BECAUSE IT SHOWS HOW MUCH MY SUPPORT TEAM HAS HELPED ME. MY STORY IS "HELPING BEGETS HELPING."

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

As Susan continue to address the audience, her smile widens with honor and appreciation.  ${\tt SUSAN} \quad ({\tt CONT"D})$ 

I AM SO GRATEFUL FOR ALL
THE HELP THAT OTHERS HAVE
GIVEN ME, AND I TRULY HOPE
THAT MY STORY HELPS SOMEONE
ELSE. THANKS FOR
LISTENING.

Just then, a listener name MEGAN stands and replies.

MEGAN

HELLO, SUSAN. MY NAME IS MEGAN. WHAT AN EXCELLENT STORY! YOU HAVE PUT TOGETHER CONNECTIONS BETWEEN THE EVENTS IN YOUR STORY THAT DEMONSTRATE TO ME THE REASON THAT YOU HOLD THE RANK OF SERGEANT FIRST CLASS!

Susan smiles with a modest expression.

MEGAN (CONT'D)

I LOVE THE PHRASE "JUGGLING RESPONSIBILITIES". IT SOUNDS LIKE YOU KNOW HOW TO ORGANIZE AND MANAGE YOURSELF WELL.

Several active-duty women in the audience give a simultaneous nod of approval.  $MEGAN \quad (CONT \ D)$ 

YOU TALK MOSTLY ABOUT HOW OTHERS IN YOUR LIFE HAVE HELPED YOU. YOU HAVE A VERY GENEROUS SPIRIT, FULL OF GRATITUDE AND PRAISE FOR OTHERS. PLEASE, CONTINUE WITH MORE STORIES. THIS ONE IS GREAT AND VERY UPLIFTING!

Susan responses to Megan then turns her attention to the audience.  $$\operatorname{\mathtt{SUSAN}}$$ 

THANK YOU, MEGAN. THAT IS VERY KIND OF YOU TO SAY. I HOPE TO SHARE MORE STORIES SOON. FOR NOW, I'M WORKING TO TURN MY CURRENT STORY INTO A POSITIVE AND INSPIRATIONAL ONE.

As Susan nods to the audience and Megan returns to her seat, the band starts to play "When Johnny Comes Marching Home". Then, as if on cue, the dancers begin singing while performing a close-order drill. The audience is visibly impressed.

DISSOLVE TO:

**BLACK SCREEN:** 

As the music FADES to silence, the sound of snoring is heard.

DISSOLVE TO:

INT. BARRACKS SLEEPING QUARTERS -- NIGHT

The face of a young recruit comes INTO VIEW. He is sound asleep in the semi-darkness. PUNCH BACK to see an entire room of sleeping recruits, all snoring haphazardly.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

IN ONE WAY OR ANOTHER, WE ALL GO THROUGH SOME TYPE OF BASIC TRAINING IN OUR LIVES. IT'S A TIME AND PLACE WHERE SUBSTANTIAL CHANGES OCCUR, SENDING YOU OFF ON A DIFFERENT PATH.

TRACK WITH the Drill Sergeant from the long, narrow corridor, hastily making his way towards the snoring young men.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

BASIC TRAINING IN THE US
MILITARY IS ONE OF THOSE
CHALLENGING RESET PATHS FOR
THOSE WHO DARE TO BE GREAT,
AND PLAN TO HAVE A POSITIVE
IMPACT ON THEIR COUNTRY.

The Drill Sergeant enters the room and stands just inside the open doorway. With both hands on his waist, his formidable silhouette scans the room with meticulous calmness.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

AN HOUR IN MILITARY BASIC TRAINING MIGHT GO SOMETHING LIKE THIS:

The clash of snores around the room causes the Drill Sergeant to shake his head.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

IT'S 4:45 A.M. THE
AMPLIFIED SOUND OF DEEPSLEEP SNORING FROM THE
RECENT ARRIVAL OF NEW

RECRUITS FILLS THE BARRACKS.

Suddenly, a blaring trumpet outside in the near distance is immediately followed up by the Drill Sergeant quickly hitting the light switch.

DRILL SERGEANT #2

RISE AND SHINE! RISE AND SHINE, GENTLEMEN! EVERYBODY! UP, UP, UP!

The BRIGHT, beaming, overhead light instantly seizes the moment, as does the shouting bass of the Drill Sergeant's voice.

Without hesitation, the recruits BOLT from their deep sleeping, jump out bed, and scramble desperately to their feet.

DRILL SERGEANT #2
(CONT'D)

'CRUITS! FALL-IN TIME IS
TEN MINUTES! BE READY!

NARRATOR (V.O.)

FALL-IN MEANS TO BE OUTSIDE THE BARRACKS AND DRESSED IN UNIFORM FOR THE DAILY RUN. YOU MAY, FOR A MOMENT, THINK YOU ARE DREAMING, AND THAT YOU WILL SOON WAKE UP TO THE COOKING SCENT OF YOUR MOTHER'S PANCAKES, BACON, AND EGGS. BUT HERE, THERE'S NO SUCH LUCK. HERE, THE BUSINESS AT HAND IS TO RUN... AND RUN YOU WILL.

JUMP CUT TO:

EXT. BOOT CAMP TRAINING GROUNDS -- MORNING

The Drill Sergeant starts to run, and the new recruits follow him in three separate lines. He shouts at the top of his voice and the young men await their cue to respond.

DRILL SERGEANT #2

ONE TWO! ONE TWO!

NARRATOR (V.O.)

OH, AND NO FANCY RUNNING SHOES HERE. COMBAT BOOTS ALL THE WAY. WHATEVER IS ASKED AND ORDERED FOR YOU TO DO, THE DRILL SERGEANT

WILL DO IT FIRST WHILE LOOKING LIKE HE JUST CAME OUT OF A TANNING BOOTH, NEVER BREAKING A SWEAT, TO SHOW YOU JUST HOW EASY THINGS ARE IN BASIC TRAINING.

DRILL SERGEANT #2

ONE TWO! ONE TWO!

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THE RUN WILL LAST CLOSE TO AN HOUR. YOU'LL RUN UPHILL, DOWNHILL, OVER ROADS AND FIELDS, WITH NO STOPPING UNTIL THE DRILL SERGEANT DECIDES TO SLOW THE RUN DOWN INTO A MARCHING CADENCE. THE RHYTHM OF THE CADENCE GOES SOMETHING LIKE THIS:

DRILL SERGEANT #2

> GOING THROUGH ANY TYPE OF BASIC TRAINING IN LIFE IS TOUGH; HOWEVER, THIS TOUGHNESS WILL ALWAYS CHISEL OUT NEW AND REWARDING CHANGES.

DRILL SERGEANT #2

(In

cadence)

LEFT... LEFT... LEFT... RIGHT, LEFT!

RECRUITS

(In

unison)

LEFT... LEFT... LEFT... RIGHT, LEFT!

DRILL SERGEANT #2

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SOUND OFF!
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RECRUITS

ONE, TWO!

DRILL SERGEANT #2

SOUND OFF!

RECRUITS

THREE, FOUR!

DRILL SERGEANT #2

BRING IT ON DOWN!

RECRUITS

BRING IT ON DOWN!

DRILL SERGEANT #2 AND

RECRUITS

ONE, TWO, THREE, FOUR! ONE,

TWO! THREE, FOUR!

DRILL SERGEANT #2

COM-PAN-NEE! HALT!

The recruits stop abruptly per the Drill Sergeant's command.

CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

A Drill Sergeant standing near the side of the stage steps forward, approaches the standing veterans near the audience, then turns to the audience with a stern yet welcoming glare.

DRILL SERGEANT #3

AUDIENCE, PLEASE STAND AND

JOIN US IN OUR MARCH!

The audience stands and remains in place. All eyes are on the Drill Sergeant, who abruptly begins to shout.

DRILL SERGEANT #3

(CONT'D)

(In

cadence)

LEFT... LEFT... LEFT...

RIGHT, LEFT!

AUDIENCE AND VETERANS

(In

unison)

LEFT... LEFT... LEFT...

RIGHT, LEFT!

DRILL SERGEANT #3

WANNA GO HOME ON YOUR LEFT?

AUDIENCE AND VETERANS

YOU'RE RIGHT!

DRILL SERGEANT #3

WANNA GO HOME ON YOUR LEFT?

AUDIENCE AND VETERANS

YOU'RE RIGHT!

DRILL SERGEANT #3

SOUND OFF!

AUDIENCE AND VETERANS

ONE, TWO!

DRILL SERGEANT #3

SOUND OFF!

AUDIENCE AND VETERANS

THREE, FOUR!

DRILL SERGEANT #3

BRING IT ON DOWN!

AUDIENCE AND VETERANS

ONE, TWO, THREE, FOUR! ONE,

TWO! THREE, FOUR!

Everyone drops to a dead silence in unison, displaying perfect stillness.

DRILL SERGEANT #3

AUDIENCE, FALL OUT AND

RELAX!

The Drill Sergeant gestures to the audience and veterans to sit. They do so respectfully, with smiles and appreciation aplenty.

CUT TO:

EXT. BOOT CAMP MESS HALL -- MORNING

Although visibly exhausted, the new recruits following the Drill Sergeant into the building with expressions of relief.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THE GOOD THING ABOUT THE RUN IN MILITARY BASIC TRAINING, IS THAT YOU WILL EVENTUALLY WIND UP AT THE

MESS HALL, A.K.A. THE CAFETERIA. THIS TURNS OUT TO BE A VERY GOOD THING: "FOOD!"

INT. BOOT CAMP MESS HALL -- MORNING

The new recruits are seen eating and drinking with a heightened display of humility and gratitude. Many of them are seen smiling and laughing as they converse.

CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

As the song "The Halls of Montezuma" plays, the stage individuals, dancers, band members, audience, and veterans quickly settle down. After which, the song FADES to silence and a veteran upon the stage name JOE, stands and approaches the podium.

JOE

HELLO, LISTENERS. MY NAME IS JOE. I'M A MARINE VETERAN, AND I HAVE A STORY.

STAGE LISTENERS (In

unison)

HELLO, JOE! TELL YOUR STORY!

JOE

THANKS. AS THE SAYING
GOES: ONCE A MARINE, ALWAYS
A MARINE. YOU KNOW, MANY
PROFESSIONS COME WITH THEIR
DIFFICULTIES. IF YOU ASK
SOMEONE, "WOULD YOU DO THIS
JOB OR THAT JOB?"

Joe tilts his head a bit with a slight scowl on his face.

JOE (CONT'D)

SOME PEOPLE WILL SAY, "I'M
NOT CUT OUT FOR IT." OR "IT
WILL TAKE TOO MUCH
SCHOOLING." OR "IT'S JUST
NOT ONE OF MY CHOICES."

He gestures a hand towards himself.

JOE (CONT'D)

TO ME, SOME CHALLENGING PROFESSIONS WOULD BE A

HEART SURGEON, A JET FIGHTER PILOT, A MONK, OR EVEN A RICE-PADDY FARMER.

Joe lifts a finger.

JOE (CONT'D)

THESE PROFESSIONS TAKE TIME AND ENDURANCE, JUST LIKE GOING THROUGH MARINE TRAINING.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: A unit of Marines are hard at work on a camp site.

JOE (V.O.) (CONT'D)

FOR ME, BOOT CAMP AND ADVANCED TRAINING IN THE MARINES ALSO FALLS INTO THE CATEGORY OF A CHALLENGING PROFESSION. IF YOU ASK MOST PEOPLE, "COULD YOU BE A MARINE?" THE ANSWER WOULD PROBABLY BE, "I WISH, BUT I JUST COULDN'T ENDURE THE TRAINING."

Additional scenes of Marines working together diligently are shown.

JOE (V.O.) (CONT'D)

I BELIEVE PART OF STAYING HEALTHY MEANS CONSTANTLY PUSHING TOWARD YOUR DREAMS, NO MATTER WHAT. MY DREAM WAS TO BECOME A MARINE.

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

Joe pauses momentarily as he scans the faces of fellow marines standing near the audience.  ${\tt JOE}$  (CONT'D)

AND LIKE MY FELLOW
BROTHERS, I WORKED HARD TO
BECOME ONE. IT TOOK A LOT
OF TIME, EFFORT, AND
ENDURANCE, BUT I FINALLY
MADE IT-ONE STEP AT A
TIME. IT WAS VERY GOOD FOR
ME TO TELL YOU HOW I FEEL
IN THIS STORY. I THANK
YOU, AUDIENCE, AND
LISTENERS, FOR ALLOWING ME
TO SHARE.

Just then, a veteran-listener name DAVE stands and replies.

HELLO, JOE. SEMPER FI. MY NAME IS DAVE, AND I'M A FELLOW MARINE VETERAN. JOE, YOU'RE THE BEST OF THE BEST!

Joe gives a tight, humble grin.

DAVE (CONT'D)

JOE, AS A MARINE VETERAN,
YOU AND I KNOW THAT MARINE
BASIC TRAINING ON PARRIS
ISLAND IN SOUTH CAROLINA
TAKES GRIT, MENTAL
FORTITUDE, AND COURAGE.

Joe nods in agreement.

DAVE (CONT'D)

WE'VE BEEN THERE. I GOT A
LITTLE CHOKED UP, MAYBE A
LITTLE EMOTIONAL WITH THIS
STORY, JOE. I JUST WANTED
TO SAY THANK YOU FOR YOUR
STORY. THANK YOU, BROTHER.
THANK YOU, MARINE.

Another nod from Joe follows before he responds.

JOE

I AM SKILLED IN STAYING HEALTHY, AND I'M ALWAYS LOOKING FOR HEALTHY WAYS OF LIVING.

As Joe returns to his seat, the theme song to the movie "Rocky" begins to play. The dancers once again start to move, displaying a rough and tough athletic dance sequence. The audience appear impressed by the dancer's running prowess. After which, the dancers shift to another close-order drill.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

YOU MIGHT THINK THAT BASIC TRAINING WOULD BE THE TOUGHEST TRAINING YOU COULD GO THROUGH IN THE MILITARY. WELL, THINK AGAIN! LIKE GOING FROM COLLEGE TO GRAD SCHOOL, THE NEXT COURSE OF ACTION IN MILITARY TRAINING REQUIRES PLENTY OF EFFORT FOR ITS COMPLETION.

CUT TO:

INT. BOOT CAMP CLASSROOM -- AFTERNOON

A pair of Drill Sergeants are seen standing in front of a room of seated recruits. An instructional lecture ensues.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THE DRILL SERGEANTS WHO
TRAIN OUR MILITARY IN NONCOMMISSIONED OFFICERS (NCO)
TRAINING, AND ALL OTHER
ADVANCED TRAINING IN THE
MILITARY, SEEM TO HAVE COME
OUT OF A TIME ZONE OF
ABSOLUTE CONTROL AND
EXPERTISE.

The young men stare attentively, giving the Drill Sergeants their utmost respect and undivided attention. NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THEY KNOW EVERYTHING, DO
EVERYTHING, AND ALWAYS LOOK
LIKE THEY COULD MANAGE AND
TAKE CHARGE OF ANY
SITUATION THAT OCCURRED IN
THEIR LIVES. THESE DRILL
SERGEANTS ARE LIKE A GOOD
COACH WHO INSPIRES AND
GIVES YOU THE DIRECTION
THAT CAN PROPEL YOU TOWARDS
YOUR LIFE'S GREATEST
SUCCESSES.

The Drill Sergeants point to the white board full of written information while conveying animated gestures.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE BIG ADVANTAGE YOU HAVE IN MOVING TO THE NEXT SCHOOL OR THE NEXT PART OF MILITARY TRAINING, IS THAT THERE IS A SOLID DEPTH OF UNDERSTANDING AND EXPERIENCE THAT YOU TAKE WITH YOU FROM YOUR PRIOR TRAINING.

The young recruits are seen raising their hands to ask questions.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THIS IS GREAT BECAUSE THE CANDIDATES THAT SHOW UP FOR NCO SCHOOL IN THE MILITARY ARE NO SLOUCHES. WHEN THE DRILL SERGEANT SAYS THE RUN IS AT 4:30 A.M., THE CANDIDATES ARE READY TO RUN STRONG, SOLID AND ENDURANCE STYLE RUNS.

The young recruits are now divided into several small study group. They are seen exchanging knowledge and ideas as the Drill Sergeants look on with folded arms.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

WHEN CANDIDATES PERFORM
MANEUVERS LIKE RAPPELLING
DOWN THE TRAINING WALLS,
THEY DO IT WITH COURAGE
THAT CONTINUES TO GROW AND
TAKE ROOT, FURTHER
DEVELOPING THEIR
CONFIDENCE.

CUT TO:

INT. BARRACKS SLEEPING QUARTERS —— NIGHT The room of new recruits are seen studying intensely on their beds. Each young man in his own little world of focused concentration.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

WHEN THESE SOLDIERS STAY UP ALL NIGHT PERFORMING DIFFICULT NIGHT MANEUVERS, KNOWING THE NEXT DAY THEY WILL BE DOING MORE OF THE SAME, THESE FINE YOUNG MEN WILL SAY:

A written test is underway. The young men are seen with intense expressions as they work their way through the assignment.

RECRUITS (V.O.)
(In
unison)

I GOT THIS, WHAT'S NEXT? I GOT THIS WHAT'S NEXT? I GOT THIS WHAT'S NEXT?

NARRATOR (V.O.)

ONE OF THE DUTIES DURING NCO TRAINING IS TO BE IN

CHARGE FOR A DAY AS A FIRST SERGEANT. THIS IS AN EXACTING TASK.

CUT TO:

EXT. BOOT CAMP TRAINING GROUNDS -- MORNING

The Drill Sergeant points to one of the recruits. The chosen young man strides forward with confidence then turns alongside the Drill Sergeant to face the stoic rows of his fellow recruits.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

WHEN PICKED FOR THIS DUTY, YOU ARE REQUIRED TO ATTEND AN ESTABLISHED NCO MEETING WITH THE LIEUTENANTS AND CAPTAIN FOR A BRIEFING ON THE PROTOCOL FOR THE NEXT DAY'S TRAINING.

The chosen young man starts to instruct his fellow recruits as they all march in place in unison. CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

One of the dancers stands in front of the group of dancers, marching in cadence. The group follows the young man's lead, displaying a tough fitness routine.

Suddenly, they halt in unison and look at the audience with strong, confident expressions. After which, they move and assemble into four platoon-like lines before turning to face the FIRST SERGEANT.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

WHEN THE NEXT MORNING
COMES, THE ACTING FIRST
SERGEANT IS IN THE
SPOTLIGHT, CALLING THE FULL
COMPANY UNIT TO ORDER IN A
FOOTBALL-SIZED FIELD. IT
GOES SOMETHING LIKE THIS:

The First Sergeant suddenly assumes command of the dancers with a powerful, attention-seizing voice.

FIRST SERGEANT

COMPANY! A-TEN-SHUN! REPORT!

The four dancers in front of each line assume the role of PLATOON SERGEANTS. The four young men suddenly respond with a SNAPPING, perfect salute. After which, the dancer assuming the role of CAPTAIN, steps forward from behind the First Sergeant to receive the report.

PLATOON SERGEANT #1

FIRST PLATOON ALL PRESENT AND ACCOUNTED FOR!
PLATOON SERGEANT #2

SECOND PLATOON ALL PRESENT AND ACCOUNTED FOR!

PLATOON SERGEANT #3

THIRD PLATOON ALL PRESENT AND ACCOUNTED FOR!

PLATOON SERGEANT #4

FOURTH PLATOON ALL PRESENT AND ACCOUNTED FOR!

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THE FIRST SERGEANT, WITH HIS ABOUT-FACE, THEN TURNS, PAUSES, AND SALUTES THE CAPTAIN, ALSO KNOWN AS THE COMPANY COMMANDER.

FIRST SERGEANT

SIR!... NCO TRAINING
COMPANY ALL PRESENT AND
ACCOUNTED FOR, SIR!"

The Captain salutes the First Sergeant.

CAPTAIN

CARRY ON, SERGEANT.

As the Captain steps away from the men, the "Rocky" theme song begins to FADE into silence. NARRATOR (V.O.)

AND THAT'S JUST THE BEGINNING OF THE DAY.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Various scenes from World War II are shown as the song "Hands Across the Sea" plays for a minute.

CUT TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

The audience continues to look intently towards the stage. Once the stage individuals conclude their chats, chuckles, handshakes, and smiles, they all settle in their seats. After which, an elderly veteranlistener wearing thick bifocals name POP gingerly approaches the podium.

POP

HELLO, LISTENERS. I'M AN OLD-WORLD WAR II VET. YOU CAN CALL ME POP.

STAGE LISTENERS

HI, POP. PLEASE, TELL US YOUR STORY.

I RECKON I WILL.

Pop struggles a bit to look over the podium. He abruptly clears his throat.

POP (CONT'D)

YOU KNOW, AFTER ALL THIS TIME, I WONDER IF FOLKS WILL BE CALLING WORLD WAR II 'ANCIENT HISTORY'. IF SO, I GOTTA TELL YA; THAT'S OKAY BY ME.

Pop's gestures are subtle yet precise as he speaks.

POP (CONT'D)

MY TRAINING FROM LONG AGO HAS SERVED ME WELL. IN WORLD WAR II, THE U.S. NAVY NEEDED WHAT THEY CALLED CONSTRUCTION BATTALIONS, OR SEABEES. WHEN I ENTERED THE NAVY, I KNEW NOTHING AT ALL ABOUT CONSTRUCTION.

<INSERT STOCK FOOTAGE>: Scenes from World War II are shown of Navy petty officers working as Seabees.

POP (V.O.) (CONT'D)

I DEVELOPED MY SKILLS THROUGH THE EXCELLENT TRAINING I RECEIVED, WITH ON-THE-JOB EXPERIENCE AND MY INVOLVEMENT WITH TOUGH NAVAL OPERATIONS.

Additional construction battalion scenes are shown.

POP (V.O.) (CONT'D)

FAST-FORWARD TO THE PRESENT, I AM NOW LIVING ON A WELL-DESERVED PENSION THAT STARTED WITH ME BEING IN THE CONSTRUCTION BUSINESS BECAUSE OF MY NAVAL TRAINING.

## JUMP CUT TO:

Post WWII scenes of robust men wearing hard-hats and reflective safety vests on commercial construction sites are shown.

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

Pop flashes the audience a coy grin as he adjusts his bifocals.

POP (CONT'D)

SINCE THEN, I'VE BEEN
LIVING WELL, AND I'M REALLY
HAVING FUN TELLING MY
STORY. IT FEELS GOOD TO BE
ABLE TO SHARE MY JOURNEY.

A listener name DAVE stands to reply.

DAVE

HI, POP. DAVE HERE. I AM IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY, AS WELL; AND HEARING YOUR STORY GIVES ME GOOSEBUMPS. I FEEL SO MUCH STRENGTH AND PURPOSE IN YOUR VOICE AS YOU TELL YOUR STORY.

Dave places his hand on his chest.

DAVE (CONT'D)

YOU REPRESENT THE HEART OF CONSTRUCTION WORKERS. WE ARE THE PART OF AMERICA THAT WORKS VERY HARD, USING STRENUOUS PHYSICAL LABOR AND GIVING OUR VERY BEST EFFORT.

Dave nods respectfully, bowing slightly to the shorter, elderly man.

DAVE (CONT'D)

CONSTRUCTION HAS ITS
CHALLENGING TIMES, BUT WHEN
YOU GO TO WORK AND DO YOUR
PART, YOU ALWAYS FEEL THIS
DEEP SENSE OF SELF-WORTH
AND SATISFACTION. YOU
WALKED THE SOLID WALK, POP.
AND FOR THAT, I THANK YOU,
WITH GREAT SINCERITY, FOR
SHARING YOUR STORY.

POP

THANK YOU, DAVE.

Pop turns his attention to the audience.

POP (CONT'D)

SMALL MOVES BUILD LONG, STEADY ROADS. IF I UPLIFT OTHERS, IT WILL UPLIFT ME.

The audience acknowledges Pop as he returns hurriedly to his seat. Just then, the overture song from the movie THE TEN COMMANDMENTS begins to play.

Reacting on cue, the dancers commence with yet another impressive, choreographed interpretation. The audience looks in awe as the dancers move swiftly with profiles and action.

The lead dancer, who assumes the role of the martyr SAINT CHRISTOPHER. He and the dancers appear to look across a wide river before standing triumphantly.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

WE SEE MANY SIMILARITIES
BETWEEN THE MEN AND WOMEN
OF OUR VETERANS AND
MILITARY AND THE
CHARACTERISTICS OF SAINT
CHRISTOPHER.

The dancers continue their lively dance sequence.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THERE ARE LEGENDS WHICH
RELATE MANY DIFFERENT
STORIES TO US ABOUT THE MAN
NAMED SAINT CHRISTOPHER.
MUCH OF WHAT HAS BEEN
WRITTEN AND PASSED DOWN TO
US THROUGHOUT THE YEARS
PERTAINS TO THE
EXTRAORDINARILY POSITIVE
SERVICES WE ARE TOLD HE
UNDERTOOK FOR PEOPLE DURING
HIS LIFETIME.

The dancers make their way over to the standing members of each military branch and display sequence of thanks and appreciation.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

TAKE FOR INSTANCE THE OATH OF SERVICE A MILITARY MAN OR WOMAN TAKES WHEN ENTERING THE MILITARY.
MILITARY PERSONNEL PROMISE TO SERVE AND DEFEND THEIR COUNTRY WHEN THEY TAKE THE OATH OF SERVICE.

After which, the dancers transform their movements into a serious display to perform the honor of taking oath as soldiers.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE OATH COULD BE SUMMED UP LIKE THIS: REGARDLESS OF POLITICAL VIEWS, RACE, RELIGION, OR ANY OTHER DIVERSE SIDES THAT WE AMERICANS MAY TAKE, THE MILITARY PERSON WILL DEFEND THE COUNTRY AND YOU FROM ANY HARM.

They then step to the nearby American flag and salute in unison.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THIS SERVICE OF OUR
VETERANS AND PRESENT
MILITARY, THEIR SACRIFICE,
STRENGTH, AND PROTECTION
ARE THE RIVER CROSSINGS OF
STRENGTH AND PERSEVERANCE
THAT BACK UP THE FREEDOM OF
THE UNITED STATES OF
AMERICA AND THE FREE WORLD.

After the overture song dies down to silence, the dancers about-face the Vice Admiral on stage who stands at full attention. With this, the song "This Land Is Your Land" begins to play.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

BECAUSE OF THIS
IMPARTIALITY AND DEDICATION
OF SERVICE THAT WE CAN
READILY SEE IN OUR VETERANS
AND MILITARY MEN AND WOMEN,
WE CAN SEE THAT THE SAINT
CHRISTOPHER EFFECT IS ALIVE
AND WELL AND IS
CONTINUOUSLY DISPLAYED WITH
A STRONG RESOLVE THAT WILL
NEVER FAIL.

The dancers show their unwavering determination and readiness to embrace their taken oath to proudly serve.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

TODAY, WE VIEW SAINT
CHRISTOPHER AS THE
PROTECTOR OF TRAVELERS. WE
NOW PROUDLY PROCLAIM THAT
OUR VETERANS AND MILITARY
ARE EFFECTIVELY OUR "SAINT
CHRISTOPHER'S OF FREEDOM".

In a beautifully choreographed fashion, the dancers slowly march across then off the stage. Once they exit, the song FADES and the excitement from the audience gradually subsides. After the Vice Admiral returns to his seat, a veteran name BARRY stands and approaches the podium.

BARRY

HELLO, LISTENERS. MY NAME IS BARRY, AND I WOULD VERY MUCH LIKE TO TELL MY STORY.

STAGE LISTENERS

TELL US YOUR STORY, BARRY!

BARRY

IN THE BEGINNING OF MY MILITARY BASIC TRAINING, I WAS ONE OF THOSE GRUNTS, A LITTLE SLOWER AT PICKING UP THE TRAINING MANEUVERS THAT WERE REQUIRED TO PASS BASIC TRAINING.

Barry shifts uncomfortably and pauses a moment.

BARRY (CONT'D)

THE PHYSICAL TRAINING WAS THE TOUGHEST. I JUST COULD NOT PASS THAT LOW-CRAWL PHYSICAL TEST WITHIN THE REQUIRED TIME.

CUT TO:

EXT. BOOT CAMP TRAINING GROUNDS -- AFTERNOON A group of young recruits are struggling through the trials of the obstacle course. BARRY (V.O.)

AS WE MOVED INTO THE WEEKS OF TRAINING, THERE WAS THIS SUPER ATHLETIC GUY IN THE SAME PLATOON AS ME, WHO BECAME MY FRIEND. I CALLED HIM BIG G. HE TOOK ME UNDER HIS WING.

A more agile recruit can be seen assisting a troubled recruit.

BARRY (V.O.) (CONT'D)

HE EXAMINED MY LOW-CRAWL
AND SAID THESE WORDS, WHICH
HELPED ME IMMENSELY: "THE

LOW-CRAWL JUST HAS A LOT TO DO WITH A GOOD TECHNIQUE.

The agile recruit is seen giving advice as he gestures and points to specific sections of various apparatuses.

BARRY (V.O.) (CONT'D)

WITH BIG G'S COACHING AND PRACTICING HOW TO USE MY FOREARM AS THE PUSHING STRENGTH FOR THE LOW-CRAWL, I REALIZED THAT I COULD MOVE AT A MUCH FASTER PACE. I PASSED ALL THE PHYSICAL TESTS IN BASIC TRAINING WITH BIG G'S HELP.

The agile recruit, as well as fellow recruits, celebrate the troubled recruit's success. The smile, cheer, and give him high-fives and pats on the back.

SWITCH BACK TO: MAIN SCENE

Barry raises his hand sharply with an honorable salute.

BARRY (CONT'D)

I SALUTE YOU, BIG G, WHEREVER YOU ARE! IT IS BECAUSE OF YOU THAT I AM HERE TODAY, TELLING THIS STORY. I TRULY ENJOYED SHARING THIS EXPERIENCE.

A listeners name Sally stands with a huge smile across her face.

SALLY

HI, BARRY! I AM SALLY.
WOW! YOU HAVE TOLD SUCH A
GREAT STORY--A SHORT ABOUT
PEOPLE RISING AND HELPING
ONE ANOTHER DURING THEIR
MILITARY SERVICE DAYS.

Sally appears on the verge of joyful tears.

SALLY (CONT'D)

THE AMAZING THING ABOUT YOUR STORY IS HOW OPPOSITE TYPES OF PEOPLE CAN JOIN FORCES TO MAKE THINGS BETTER FOR ALL. SUCH A SUPER STORY! A SUPER STORY, INDEED!

Sally turns to the audience.

SALLY (CONT'D)

HEY. IS BIG G OUT THERE? IF SO, PLEASE CONTACT ME. I AM AVAILABLE.

As Sally giggles, chuckles erupt from the audience and stage panel. Sally then turns back to Barry, lifting both her hands over her heart.

SALLY (CONT'D)

THANK YOU, BARRY. THANK YOU FOR TELLING YOUR STORY.

Barry nods with welcomed appreciation then looks out across the audience.

BARRY

TELLING A GOOD STORY IS A PASSION OF MINE. I THANK YOU FOR LISTENING AND LOOK FORWARD TO SHARING MORE OF MY IMPORTANT JOURNEY.

DISSOLVE TO:

EXT. MAIN STREET -- AFTERNOON

As the song "Give My Regards to Broadway" begins to play, TRACK WITH a strikingly handsome MOVIE STAR as he makes his way out of a limousine and starts walking down the busy sidewalk. Passersby and bystanders recognize the movie star with pleasant surprise. He smiles, waves, and shakes several hands as he proceeds.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

HAVE YOU EVER MET A ROCK STAR, MOVIE STAR, OR ATHLETIC STAR? HOW DO YOU IMAGINE IT MIGHT MAKE YOU FEEL? PERHAPS SOMETHING LIKE THIS?

After which, the movie star and his ASSISTANT approach a storefront window and unexpectedly pause.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOU ARE WALKING DOWN YOUR HOMETOWN'S MAIN STREET AND PAUSE TO LOOK AT AN INTERESTING DISPLAY IN A STORE WINDOW.

Something in the window catches their attention and they begin to chat. From across the street, a FAN of the movie star suddenly notices him.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOU NOTICE A PERSON A SHORT DISTANCE AWAY WHO LOOKS VERY FAMILIAR. YOU SEE AND

RECOGNIZE THE PERSON AS A FAMOUS MOVIE STAR.

The fan is visibly excited and cannot control her elation.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOUR HEART STARTS TO BEAT FASTER; YOUR LEGS GO WOBBLY, YOU GET ALL FLUSHED AND YOU GIGGLE.

The young lady giggles and quickly makes her way across the street to approach the movie star.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE MOVIE STAR APPROACHES AND PAUSES TO LOOK IN THE SAME STORE WINDOW, AND CASUALLY, STRIKES UP A CONVERSATION WITH YOU.

The young lady steps alongside the movie star and his assistant, uninvitingly joining them to admire the display in the window. The movie star notices her then turns to speak.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOU CHAT AMIABLY FOR AN EXTENDED PERIOD, LEARN THAT YOU HAVE A LOT IN COMMON, AND EVENTUALLY THE MOVIE STAR ASKS IF YOU CAN RECOMMEND A GOOD RESTAURANT IN TOWN.

The assistant takes a step back as the movie star and his fan engage in an enthralling conversation. JUMP CUT TO:

INT. TOWN RESTAURANT -- AFTERNOON

The movie star and his fan are sitting across a dining table from one another. The assistant is seated a good distance away at the coffee counter.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

YOU PASS ON YOUR BEST ADVICE. THE CHARMING MOVIE STAR THANKS YOU.

The movie star asks for more advice. The fan passes along the information to him.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

HAVING GREATLY ENJOYED YOUR CONVERSATION, HE CONVEYS APPRECIATION OF THE FACT THAT YOU HAVE ALSO BEEN VERY HELPFUL AND INVITES YOU TO KEEP IN TOUCH

THROUGH A PHONE NUMBER EXCHANGE.

The movie star writes down his telephone number and hands it to her.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

WOW! SUPER EXCITING! AS SOON AS YOU TAKE THE NEXT FEW STEPS FROM THIS ENCOUNTER, YOU ARE TEXTING AND EMAILING AND CALLING YOUR FAMILY AND FRIENDS TO TELL THEM YOU'RE NOW FRIENDS WITH A FAMOUS MOVIE STAR.

JUMP CUT TO:

INT. SEDAN -- AFTERNOON

The fan is on her cell phone ecstatically sharing her excitement with her girlfriends.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

YOU KNOW WHAT? IT IS EXCITING TO SHARE A VERY POSITIVE EXPERIENCE AND RELATE A STORY THAT'S UPLIFTING AND FUN FOR OTHERS TO HEAR.

JUMP CUT TO:

INT. AIRPORT -- AFTERNOON

A WEARY TRAVELER scrolling through his electronic tablet sits in the crowded waiting area, restlessly awaiting his flight departure.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

SUPPOSE YOU ARE IN AN AIRPORT, MAYBE A STORE, A RESTAURANT, OR ANY PUBLIC PLACE.

The weary traveler looks up from his tablet- to read the overhead arrival/departure board.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

AS YOU GLANCE UP, THERE IS A UNITED STATES MILITARY PERSON OR VETERAN, IN UNIFORM, WALKING INTO YOUR FIELD OF VIEW.

Suddenly, the weary traveler unexpectedly catches the sight of a uniformed military person standing only a few feet away from him.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

AS THIS MILITARY PERSON TAKES AN INADVERTENT STEP CLOSER, IT HITS YOU THAT HIS UNIFORM IS A PROUD DISPLAY OF HIS COMMITMENT TO PUBLIC SERVICE AND FREEDOM TO YOUR COUNTRY.

CLOSE-UP on the realization frozen on the traveler's face.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

DOES YOUR HEART BEAT A
LITTLE FASTER? WILL YOUR
EYES OPEN A LITTLE WIDER?

The traveler takes the liberty of sitting upright, immediately displaying better posture.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THIS MILITARY PERSON, WHO WE DO NOT EVEN KNOW, IS DEFENDING NOT ONLY OUR HOME SOIL, BUT EACH ONE OF US, EVERY SINGLE DAY.

As the military person attentively reads the arrival/departure board, the traveler appears to study the uniform with sincere admiration.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE UNIFORM WORN BY THIS PERSON SIGNIFIES THAT THIS IS A PROTECTOR OF ALL THAT WE CONSIDER TO BE SACRED AND SECURE.

The traveler glances at his watch then inserts his tablet into his briefcase.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

NOW, WHEN THE OPPORTUNITY
ARISES, AND YOU SEE OR PASS
BY A MILITARY SERVICE
PERSON IN THEIR PROUDLY
WORN UNIFORM, YOU CAN
RESPOND TO THEM JUST AS YOU
WOULD AN ATHLETIC STAR,
ROCK STAR, OR MOVIE STAR.

The traveler stands with his briefcase in-hand and walks over to the military person.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOU CAN SMILE WIDE AND STRONG. WE ARE SEEING OUR SECURITY AND FREEDOM IN ACTION.

The military person turns to the traveler. The traveler gives him a stiff nod and a friendly, inviting smile.

MOVIE STAR

HELLO, SIR. I JUST WANTED TO SAY, THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE. I SINCERELY APPRECIATE YOU AND ALL THAT YOU DO.

Once the military person smiles in return, the men firmly shake hands.

MILITARY PERSON

THANK YOU. THAT MEANS A LOT.

NARRATOR (V.O.)

THE ROCK STAR, ATHLETIC STAR, MOVIE STAR, VETERANS AND MILITARY ARE ALL STARS AND HEROES IN THEIR OWN WAY.

The song FADES into silence.

DISSOLVE TO:

EXT. MILITARY CEREMONY YARD -- DAY

The audience, dancers, veterans, and listeners begin to settle once again. Once all is quiet and calm, a veteran name CARL stands and approaches the podium. The faces in the audience remain eager with anticipation.

CARL

MY NAME IS CARL, AND I AM COMPLETING THIS JOURNEY WITH YOU LISTENERS IN THE STEADY STATE STORY POWER. I STARTED AS ONE PERSON, AND NOW I AM FINISHING AS ANOTHER PERSON.

Individuals on the stage and in the audience give Carl encouraging nods.

CARL (CONT'D)

IT IS THROUGH YOUR
WILLINGNESS TO LISTEN THAT
HAS MADE ME REALIZE MY
WORTH, MY STRENGTH, MY
IDENTITY, AND MY PURPOSE
THAT AUTHENTICATES ME.

Carl pauses for a moment to take in the genuine stares observing him from the audience.  $CARL \quad (CONT \ 'D)$ 

WHILE BEING DISCHARGED, I
LANDED IN OAKLAND,
CALIFORNIA AND WENT THROUGH
THE DISCHARGE PROCESS
THERE. ON THE FLIGHT HOME,
I MUST HAVE DREAMED OF A
HUNDRED DIFFERENT WONDERFUL
SCENARIOS THAT WOULD OCCUR
WHEN I GOT HOME.

CARL (CONT'D)

WHAT MADE ME THE HAPPIEST
ON THAT FLIGHT HOME WAS
THAT I WAS GOING TO SEE ALL
THE PEOPLE AND ALL THOSE
PLACES THAT I TOOK FOR
GRANTED BEFORE. NOW, I
COULD NOT WAIT TO SEE THEM
AND VISIT THEM ALL AGAIN.

PAN ACROSS the faces of the dancers and band members.

CARL (V.O.) (CONT'D)

WHEN I FIRST GOT HOME, I
HAD A STORY TO TELL, BUT I
WAS TOO HESITANT TO IMPOSE
MY MEMORIES UPON MY FAMILY
AND THE PEOPLE I KNEW. THE
UPS AND DOWNS I EXPERIENCED
WERE TOUGH.

PAN ACROSS the faces of the standing military groups.

CARL (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THE MOST IMPORTANT THING I HAVE REALIZED WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE VETERAN'S LISTENING POST IS THAT I REALLY CAN CHANGE MY STORY, TRANSFORMING ME FROM THAT WHY-ME PERSON INTO A POSITIVE GO-TO PERSON.

PAN ACROSS the faces of the audience veterans.

CARL (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOU KNOW, WHEN PEOPLE TAKE
THE TIME TO LISTEN TO US
VETS AND MILITARY, THERE IS
SUCH A WONDERFUL FEELING OF

RECOGNITION AND APPRECIATION.

PAN ACROSS the faces of the audience listeners.

CARL (V.O.) (CONT'D)

REALLY, IT IS NOTHING SHORT OF MIRACULOUS. I WOULD LIKE TO SAY, MANY THANKS TO ALL OF YOU WHO TAKE THE TIME TO BE LISTENERS.

PAN ACROSS the faces of the stage panel.

CARL (V.O.) (CONT'D)

I HAVE ENJOYED EVERY
SESSION, AND I'LL STAY
CONNECTED TO THE STEADY
STATE STORY POWER, WHICH
LEADS TO UPLIFTING AND
POSITIVE OUTCOMES FOR ME.

Suddenly, Carl pumps this fist and shouts into the mic.

CARL (CONT'D)

LISTENERS, YOU ROCK!

As everyone explodes into a standing ovation, the song "God Bless America" begins. NARRATOR (V.O.)

LET US POUR OUT SOME GRATITUDE FOR THOSE IN OUR SUPPORT NETWORKS, BECAUSE THEY ARE ALWAYS GIVING AND TRYING.

Both in the audience and upon the stage, countless smiles, hugs, and handshakes are exchanged. NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

LET US ALSO POUR OUT SOME LARGE DOSES OF FORGIVENESS FOR OURSELVES AND OTHERS. AND PLEASE, LET US ALWAYS INCLUDE LARGE DOSES OF HUMOR AND LAUGHTER.

Sincere display of kind gestures and warm affection continue.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

THANK YOU FOR SHARING YOUR STORIES. WE AT THE VETERANS LISTENING POST WOULD LIKE TO THANK YOU FOR SHARING THIS JOURNEY WITH

US. IT WOULD BE REMISS OF US NOT TO MENTION, THAT IN THE WORLD TODAY, MORE THAN EVER, IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE TAKE CARE OF EACH OTHER AND CELEBRATE ALL WHO HAVE MADE A DIFFERENCE IN THEIR COMMUNITIES AND THEIR COUNTRY.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

BY BEING A PART OF THIS EXPERIENCE, YOU ARE NOW A VALUED VMLP LISTENER. YOU WILL SEE THE POSITIVE CHANGE YOU WILL HAVE JUST BY LISTENING.

"God Bless America" starts to FADE into silence.

NARRATOR (V.O.) (CONT'D)

YOU ARE NOW PART OF THE PASS-IT-FORWARD MISSION TO CONNECT AND RECOGNIZE OUR VETERANS AND MILITARY. THANK YOU SO VERY MUCH FOR YOUR TIME.

Suddenly, the band starts to play "My Country 'Tis Of Thee". After which, veterans, military, listeners, and civilians alike, come together to sing the lyrics to the song.

DISSOLVE TO:

As the music and singing continue, PUSH IN on a CLOSE-UP of the American Flag seen blowing symbolically in the wind.

The End FADE TO BLACK:
